Short-term supervision – extended care for schoolchildren

Who can have short-term supervision?

Schoolchildren over the age of 12 years who have a functional impairment may be granted short-term supervision – extended after-school care. To qualify for short-term supervision the applicant must be covered by LSS and must be assessed to have a need for this form of care. The assessment is made by the municipality's aid officer.

What is short-term supervision?

You as a schoolchild with a functional impairment can have supervision before and after the school day and during school holidays for a higher age than the normal childcare services offer. Short-term supervision includes personal care, activation, social contact and support during meals.

Gävle municipality, Education & Work* and Children & Young people* are responsible for these operations but you apply for short-term supervision to Omvårdnad Gävle.

What does it cost?

Short-term supervision costs nothing but you pay a charge for food and snacks.
